Celebrating the life of Ray Shinner – there was a tremendous turnout at Ray's wake last month. Ray was known to, and liked by, so many people in this area. Very much a local, he was born, the youngest of three brothers, in H/ford and lived here for almost all of his life. Apprenticed as a mason with Staverton Builders, Ray became a skilled general builder. Those skills and his warm, cheerful character meant that he was never short of work. He was an important part of H/ford history - a fount of local knowledge and he had a tremendous recall of village stories (most of them true!) and families. So his passing is an enormous sorrow to us all. Ray was a kind, wise man with a dry & amusing take on life. He was a dearly loved husband, father & grandfather. In Loving Memory of Victoria - a life that touched so many with compassion and generosity. Victoria Conway has died aged 73. She lived for many years in H/ford where she was known and respected for her involvement in the community. She was an active participant in St Peter's church activities and was training to lead services before suffering a severe illness. She also drove the Harbourne Shuttle. Victoria and husband Hugh moved here to run a yacht brokerage in Dartmouth. After selling the business she joined Disability Focus in Totnes where she helped very many disabled people manage their financial affairs. Latterly she moved to France and died peacefully at home. Victoria will be missed by all who were touched by her compassionate nature.

David Wragg died at home on June 28th, aged 76. He had lived in the village for almost twenty years. David will be very much missed by his friends.

Barbara Martin of Bow Road sadly lost her three-year battle with cancer on 12th July. Fred, her husband of 57 years, devoted himself to caring for her. They moved to H/ford in 2014 and shared eleven wonderful years here.


